# **CHOOSING A TREAT** Naking the best selection



LOW FAT

reach for treats that are preferably 5% or less but no more than 7% fat. This is especially true for dogs suffering from chronic pancreatitis



SMALL SIZE

BREAK IT UP If they are large treats, break them down into smaller pieces for your pup, unless it is just an extremely small bite sized treat



HARD OPT FOR HARDER Opt for harder treats over softer ones as this will take more time to chew through. This is especially helpful f your dog is food motivated



LIMITED

LIMITED INGREDIENT

Look for treats that are very limited in ingredients, if they are meat based opt for chicken or lamb treats



ALL NATURAL

#### GO AU NATURALE

Steer more towards natural treats for my pup, such as dried sweet potato skins or other chews



HOMEMADE

#### PAY FOR IT

Make your own treats using the recipes on thepetsdigest.com or give them veggies like I carrots and apples (without the skin)

#### ACTIVATED CHARCOAL

Activated charcoal is also known as active carbon, absorbent charcoal, or activated carbon. Many times vets add it to a dog's treatments that came into the clinic for pancreatitis. It is used for detoxification and absorption of toxins in the intestines



#### HYDROGEN PEROXIDE

Three percent hydrogen peroxide can be used to induce vomiting in dogs that have eaten something that may upset their stomach. This is to get the toxins out of their systems quickly.

### UNFLAVORED PEDIALYTE

Pedialyte has a ton of electrolytes that can be used to assist with dehydration in dogs that occurs due to vomiting and diarrhea.



EMERGENCY NUMBERS

If your dog has a relapse having emergency numbers on hand where you can easily find them is great to have so you don't have to search around in a panic.
